

In the month of February, Harvest House serviced 11 foster families, 1 adoptive parent, Alee Shelter, and 5 kids/teens from Latte Treatment Center through the Harvest House Resource Center which we provided for them the basic necessities of clothes, shoes, and essentials. We held our monthly support group meeting for our foster moms with focused discussion on behavior management in foster children that display rage because of their traumatic past. We had two events held this month. On Valentine's Day, the foster children made Valentine cards and brought some sweet treats to bring to CPS to show their love and appreciation to their social workers for all the hard work they put in as the voices of these children. Our second event was a babysitting day for foster children with the focus on teaching them how to make an outside garden. The children were able to make their own cookbook, plant a garden outside the Resource Center, and bring a seed to plant at home. Harvest House also received a total of \$920.00 in monetary donations to help in our ongoing efforts to love the foster children on Guam.
